- Drive work vehicle(s) as needed.
- Travel for project/trial completion, training provision, and meetings.

Education:

- Preferred candidate may have a Bachelor of Science with coursework in entomology, biology, animal husbandry, and/or agrifood or agriculture.
- Preferred coursework in apiculture, project management, training provision, and/or research conduct and management.



Experience:

- Two years or more experience in a team setting.
- One year or more experience in field or laboratory research.
